

1. Objective

Goal: Pot all your designated color coins (black or white) and the queen (red), covering the queen by potting
one of your own coins after it is potted.

2. Setup

- Players: 1vs1 (two players).
- Board: Standard 29-inch Carrom board with 18 coins (9 white, 9 black) and 1 queen.
- Striker: A heavier piece used to strike the coins.

3. Starting the Game

- Coin Toss: Decides who breaks and which color (white or black) to play.
- Break Shot: The first player strikes the coins from the center circle.

4. Rules of Play

- Turns: Players alternate turns, striking their own color coins into pockets.
- Striking: Coins must be hit with the striker and must contact the player's own color.
- Queen: Must be potted and then covered by potting one of your coins on the same or next turn. If not covered, it's returned to the center.
- Points: Potting a white or black coin earns 1 point. Potting and covering the queen earns 3 points.

5. Fouls and Penalties

Fouls:

- Striking the opponent's coins.
- Potting the striker (scratch).
- Not striking within 30 seconds.

Penalties:

- Free Shot: The opponent gets a free shot for a foul.
- Scratch: If the striker is potted, the opponent gets a free



6. Winning the Game

- Victory: A player wins by potting maximum coins and covering the queen.
- **Sudden Death:** If the queen isn't potted and covered, or the game is tied, a sudden-death round may be played.

7. Time Limits

- **Shot Time:** Players have 30 seconds per shot. Exceeding this forfeits the shot.
- Match Time: A total time limit (e.g., 30 minutes) may be imposed for longer matches.

8. Player Conduct

- Sportsmanship: Players must show respect for opponents, referees, and equipment.
- **Disqualification:** Disrespectful behaviour or cheating can lead to disqualification.
- Referee's Decision: The referee's decision is final on all matters.

9. Miscellaneous

- Striker: Must remain within the striking circle during play.
- Equipment: Handle the board and coins with care. Any damage may result in penalties.

10 Tournament Format

- Structure: The tournament can follow a knockout format.
- Referees: Qualified referees will manage the matches and resolve disputes.
